Position Summary

The Confluencenter for Creative Inquiry (CCI) at the University of Arizona is in search of a Project Manager for extended temporary employment. The Program Manager is responsible for overseeing and ensuring the successful completion of programs and activities related to the center's ongoing border storytelling and education project entitled *Fronteridades: Nurturing Collaborative Intersections in the U.S.-Mexico Borderlands*. This project is a 30-month grant initiative funded by The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. The Fronteridades project bridges disciplines, sectors and communities in order to deepen our understanding of the U.S.-Mexico border and to diversify the perspectives and narratives that shape this region. To that end, the Program Manager will oversee specific grant activities such as funding competitions, funding disbursal, assessment and reporting, and ongoing engagement with research teams, students, and community partners.

The Program Manager will be expected to oversee and ensure the successful completion of multiple collaborative programs that comprise the Fronteridades project. This will require working and coordinating with 18 community and campus partners who are leading several of the Fronteridades programs. It will also require planning, coordinating, and overseeing multiple Fronteridades fellowship and internship programs that are based in and implemented by the CCI.

The Program Manager will serve as a liaison and point of contact between the project PI and CCI director, the CCI staff, and the project's community and faculty partners. As such, the responsibilities Program Manager are embedded within the broader goals of the center, and the Program Manager II will ensure that the various sub-programs are on task and meeting project's goals in ways that align with mission of the CCI.

CCI is a campus-wide interdisciplinary research institute that unites the Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences as a point of intersection for inquiry across all disciplines. CCI facilitates the access and exchange of knowledge between the academy and surrounding communities.





Established in 2011, CCI has created a vibrant coalition of partners beyond UArizona, including NGOs, local and international artists and art collectives, human rights advocates, and a global community of interdisciplinary scholars and cultural practitioners.

Duties & Responsibilities

- Manages project activities and resources, in consultation with the director, staff and collaborating partners.
- Manages, monitors, and ensures the successful completion of programs within the four main focus areas of the Fronteridades project – 1) Fronteridades Border Scholars, 2) Border Arts Collective, 3) Migrant and Asylum-Seeker Stories and 4) Justice on the Border Institute.
- Initiates and maintains project communications and documentation. (Includes coordinating meetings and larger project events; tracking decisions and progress and providing follow-up; and documenting project workflows and procedures.)
- Coordinates and develops reports for funding agencies; internal reports, conference, speaker series and lecture series materials and presentations, and collaborates on publications and other dissemination activities.
- Assist with project travel arrangements where needed, and project event planning.
- The Confluencenter supports the UA's diversity and inclusiveness strategic initiatives designed to create an inclusive environment for all faculty, staff, and students. The candidate is expected to support diversity and inclusiveness efforts in the department and college.
- May require travel.
- Additional duties may be assigned.
